ABOUT OUR CLUB

THE GAME

Tee ball is a game that has been adapted from baseball to make it more appropriate to the skill level of younger children. As the name suggests, the ball is hit off a tee set at approximately waist height of the batter. Apart from this major difference and a smaller diamond size, Tee Ball is played much the same as baseball. Tee Ball is the fastest growing junior sport in all major cities in Australia.

TEAM SELECTIONS

Team placements will be announced on team allocation day at Marmion Reserve (the date can be found on our calendar of events and in the welcome letter you received at registration). All players and parents **MUST** attend to ensure team placement and availability of coaches, assistant coaches, managers, and umpires. It is club policy that teams be selected based on ability with the object being that all teams in each age group should be of equal strength. However new members introduced to the club by a friend may request to be in the same team. We will also accept other team placement requests but cannot guarantee them.

VENUES

Playing fixtures are organised by the four clubs in the Fremantle district; East Fremantle, Melville, Yangebup, and Cockburn. Each team will play approximately half their games at their home ground Marmion Reserve and the other half at one of the other clubs' grounds on a rotating basis.

PLAYING TIMES

All fixtured games for 7s thru 9s are played on Saturday mornings, and duration is 60 minutes. 10s and 11s teams may be scheduled to play twilight games on Friday evenings. This has the benefits of being cooler than Saturday games played in the heat of the day at 10.30am and is often easier for parents to manage.

Your team manager will give you list of game fixtures for the season. There will be a break during the Dec/Jan school holidays with games recommencing at the end of January or beginning of February.

UNIFORMS AND EQUIPMENT

Each player will require East Fremantle Tee Ball pants, cap, and socks – these can be purchased from the club on Registration Day or Team Allocation Day, or from the uniform officer prior to the first game. Please try to organise your child's uniform well before the first game as popular sizes may become unavailable and need to be reordered. Each player will also require a baseball fielder's glove and a pair of shoes suitable for running in (to be worn at both games and training). The club provides team shirts, bats, tees, and balls. We also encourage the use of mouthguards.
