VOLUNTEER ROLES

Tee ball like most other junior sports, is totally organised and run by volunteers, mostly parents. In order to continue to provide the opportunity for primary school aged boys and girls to develop their skills, confidence, and sportsmanship through organised team sport it is essential that all parents become involved. It is for this reason that we ask all parents, including those who are new to the club, to show their willingness to volunteer in some capacity with their child's team. Even if you are new to Tee Ball, please don't let this stop you from offering your assistance, as there are many experienced people in the club to guide you through.

COACHES

All of our coaches are volunteers, e.g. parents, siblings, grandparents, etc. Most start from the beginning, learning as they go along and their child progresses thru the age-levels. The club offers each coach the opportunity to attend a local coaching accreditation course run by the Tee ball association (TBAWA). The coach's responsibility is to be a role model to their players, assist with their skill development, and encourage fun and fair play. He/She is unable to do this alone so parental assistance is encouraged.

ASSISTANT COACH

To assist the coach both at training and at the game, be willing to take over the role of coach in the event that the coach is unable to attend a game or training session.

MANAGER

To assist the coach and assistant coach with the organisation side, e.g. scorers, shade shelters, maintaining batting order during the game, ensuring players stay in the shade and have lots of drinks, distributing team information and fixtures, and to otherwise assist where needed both during the game and training. Knowledge of the game is not required, you will pick this up as the season goes along.

UMPIRE

Umpiring duties are again carried out by volunteers within the side. Prior knowledge of the game is not necessary as umpiring clinics are held in the lead up to the season and during the start of season. It is a great way to learn the rules and help the children to enjoy the game.
